GOD GOES WITH US REV. DR. JOHN A. HINKLE, JR., SENIOR PASTOR

As we enter a new year, I am fully aware that I have been doing this life thing for a while. To be exact, I have gone around the sun 57 times. I think I have lived a pretty full life, though I am also

aware that I have not always fully taken advantage of things that have been handed to me. Several years ago, I determined that I would change this about me so when I am invited to do something I do my best to say yes. I have discovered the trick to accomplish such a task is to do your best to be present in the moment. For years now I have shared with you the theological meaning of the word "Providence." Providence means nothing is by chance and that God has a purpose for every minute of our lives. Thus, when someone asks me to do something, whatever that something is,... I need to be aware that God is working in my life.

I understand this more as I reflect on the year that was. We never know what a new year might hold for us, but as the new year fades in the past, it should not surprise me how God put in my life people and places that to the world seem like chance encounters, but, on reflecting, I know they are examples of God working in my life.

Almost six years ago to the date I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. The diagnosis itself did not come as surprise since my father had prostate cancer. I just thought my prostate cancer diagnosis would happen when I was closer to 72 than 52. I am grateful that after my diagnosis and leading up to surgery and beyond, God put Dr. Greg Stewart in my life. Greg is a great doctor and he has become a good friend. I never had any doubt that Greg would take care of me, but what I was not aware of is that six years later in 2024 Greg would take care of my family also when my father was diagnosed with bladder cancer. I will not go into detail all that Greg did for my family, but I have been amazed that God used my getting prostate cancer so that I would know Greg, both for my own treatment and later for my family.

I am not sure what this new year holds for me, and that is okay, because I know wherever we are going, God is going with us.


The 2025 Session Retreat is Saturday, January 25 from 8am-12pm at church.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY




