LIVING GENEROUSLY

While I was in Montreat last month, Charlotte called to remind me that she really needed all my information for February's The Proclamation sooner rather than later. Having worked with

Charlotte for many years, I knew it was her loving way of telling me she wanted everything <u>now</u> and not later. So that is what I did, and this is what I want you to know...

On the Monday after I arrived in Montreat, with a touch of cabin fever, I got in my car and went for a drive. I drove around Montreat first. I am amazed at the work that has taken place since Hurricane Helene. I was worried that summer conferences would be canceled, but I learned that Montreat is already hosting conferences and groups without missing a beat. This is not the case with the Swannanoa Valley. Not much has changed since I was last in the area during Thanksgiving except that snow is on the ground. The amount of loss is unspeakable and pictures fail to express the needs that still exist for the community as families now find themselves living in borrowed RVs and even tents. I remember when I got back to my cabin, sitting on the couch, just saying to myself, "There but for the grace of God..."

I do not say, "There but for the grace of God" lightly, as if somehow I am lucky and some fool is not. When those words come out of the mouth, I mean them as a prayer. In moments of disaster, such as Hurricane Helene or the fires of Pacific Palisades and the surrounding areas, I count my blessings while, in the same breath, asking God how I can be a blessing to others. I believe the same is true for First Presbyterian Church. We are people who have been blessed by the Grace of God. So the question must be asked, "How are we a blessing to others?

The month of February has been set aside for Stewardship Season. This year's campaign is entitled, "Sacrifice: Living a life of Generosity." As I reflect on the grace given to me over the years, I have become aware that I can live life out of scarcity or out of abundance. Living life out of scarcity means believing that God's blessings are finite, so when we give, it would be better to hold something back. Living life in abundance believes and confesses that all good gifts have come from the very hand of God. I will let you know that a church that lives in abundance is a church that trusts God and casts a vision for the future seeking to make this world a better place. This is what I have witnessed in the life of First Presbyterian Church ever since I arrived in Murfreesboro.

So, as we pray together, "There but for the grace of God," let us seek how we can live this sacrificial life for a God who blesses us daily. In book news, I have finished the Nazi of Copley Square and Thousand Years. I am starting Where Men Win Glory.

At last week's Wonderful Wednesday, the congregation was invited to the sanctuary to hear our organist, Valerie Rains, present a show and tell of our newly refurbished organ. This coincided with a timely visit by the artists from the Luley Organ Company who had been here for the past few days for their finishing touches. They gave a wonderful demonstration of the different kinds of organ pipes and the sounds they make. They exhibited many of the tonal improvements made with the addition of new pedal reed stops, a new Festival Trumpet, and the Zimbelstern (which makes the sparkling bells sound). As they were in the process of re-installing the new facade pipes to the back wall, we were able to see their lovely new finish compared to their old burnished look. An enthusiastic and engaged crowd asked many good questions and Valerie played 3 organ pieces for us to hear many of the changes made.

We are incredibly grateful for the generosity of our congregants and the organ committee would again like to thank Luley for their incredible work; Eric Egli for being our on-site representative; and the congregation for their patience and support throughout the process. A special dedication for this rebuilt organ will be planned sometime in the future.


